


Figure 1 (data extracted on 15/11/21)




Figure 2 (data extracted on 15/11/21)

Some key points to consider

When staying inside University buildings (i.e. in rooms, corridors and other common areas), you should:

- keep a distance of at least 1.5 meters, if possible;
- cover your mouth and nose with a mask, with the exception of people participating in classes, employee meetings, e.g. within a given institute, meetings of various bodies, etc., once they have taken their seat¹;
- wash or disinfect your hands as often as possible (with soap and/or disinfectants);
- air rooms frequently;
- refrain from direct contact, e.g. by shaking hands;
- avoid congregating, in particular in common parts of buildings;
- avoid touching your eyes, mouth and nose;
- stay at home when you notice strong symptoms of cold or illness;
- avoid contact with sick people.

Every student and University employee is advised to become familiar with the current sanitary requirements, recommendations and notices issued by:

- 1) the Chief Sanitary Inspector (www.gis.gov.pl);
- 2) the Minister of Health (www.gov.pl/web/koronawirus);
- 3) Poznań University of Economics and Business (in particular at: https://ue.poznan.pl/pl/uni University,c13/informacje-w-zwiazku-z korawirusem, c14267 /); as well as any other applicable regulations concerning, in particular, the coronavirus.

In matters not regulated by this ordinance, students and University employees should follow the procedures and guidance on preventing the spread of the SARS-CoV-2 coronavirus and generally applicable provisions of the law.

Information concerning teaching and participating in classes, steps to be taken in case of a suspected SARS-CoV-2 coronavrius infection, and precautions to be taken when working inside University buildings can be found on the PUEB website in the "Coronavirus" tab.

This ordinance enters into force on October 1, 2021.

¹ The obligation to cover the mouth and nose in the University buildings can be disregarded by people who cannot comply with this requirement owing to pervasive developmental disorders, mental disorders, moderate, severe or profound intellectual disability or people who find it difficult to cover or uncover their mouth or nose on their own.

Please note that apart from the general requirement of 1.5metre separation between pedestrians, your mouth and nose should be covered in the following places:

- in buses, trams and trains,
- in shops, malls, banks, markets and post offices
- in cinemas and theatres,
- in public spaces of restaurants and pubs, e.g. toilets
- at physician's offices, in outpatient clinics and hospitals, in massage and tattoo parlours
- in churches, at schools and universities,
- In government offices (when going there to take care of certain matters) and other civic centres.

It is **not mandatory** to cover your mouth and nose in forests, parks, green squares, botanical gardens, historic gardens, family community gardens and on beaches as well as while travelling by private car.
